#### Update on TCCS Activities Report by Dr R. Gowribalan, Project Lead – Coodal

We are pleased to report continued progress in the rollout of TCCS (Thrift and Credit Cooperative Societies) initiatives across Northern Sri Lanka, particularly in the districts of Vavuniya, Kilinochchi, Mannar, and Badulla.

# a. Vavuniya TCCS

Funds were distributed across four TCCs as follows:

#### 1. Chettikulam

- 12 projects funded
- ₹6 Lakhs allocated
- Harvest has been completed; sale of rice is pending

#### 2. Maruthodai

- o 10 projects funded
- o ₹5 Lakhs allocated
- Awaiting progress report

#### 3. Pulvanayar

- 10 projects funded
- ₹5 Lakhs allocated
- Project reports received

#### 4. **Oonchalpity**

- 10 projects funded
- ₹10 Lakhs allocated
- Progress report pending

### b. Kilinochchi TCCS

- ₹20 Lakhs allocated
- Funded by our Board member, Dr Pushpam Moorthy
- Feedback shared via the CIC Coodal WhatsApp platform

#### c. Mannar TCCS

- Funded through the Ayngaran Memorial Fund
- £1,536.47 transferred on 24 April 2025

## d. Badulla TCCS

The following four TCCs are actively participating: Siharam, Aruvi, Sakthi, and Vanavil

- Operated through local co-operative societies
- Three TCCs are registered with the Department of Co-operatives
- University students have visited all four TCCs and provided positive evaluations
- Three TCCs have begun collecting loan repayments and reissuing funds to new members
- Detailed progress reports have been shared with project sponsors

#### **Individual TCC Updates:**

- Aruvi: 10 families have successfully launched their projects and begun repaying loans
- Sakthi: All 10 families are active and have started loan repayments
- Vanavil: All 10 families are progressing well and are also repaying loans
