Coodal

Campaigning and Political Activity Policy & Procedures

1. Purpose

This policy sets out how Coodal engages in campaigning and political activity, ensuring all actions are consistent with our charitable purposes, values, and the requirements of UK charity law.

2. Scope

This policy applies to trustees, staff, volunteers, and anyone acting on behalf of Coodal.

3. Principles

- Charitable focus: All campaigning and political activities must further Coodal's charitable purposes.
- **Independence**: Coodal is strictly independent of political parties and will not support or oppose any political party, candidate, or elected representative.
- Transparency: Activities must be open, honest, and accountable.
- **Proportionality**: Activities must be reasonable, balanced, and not the sole or continuing activity of the charity.
- Compliance: All campaigning and political activity will comply with Charity Commission guidance (CC9), electoral law, and relevant legislation.

4. Definitions

- Campaigning: Awareness-raising, influencing public attitudes, or seeking to secure or oppose a change in law or policy that furthers our charitable objectives.
- **Political Activity**: Specific activity aimed at securing or opposing a change in the law, policy, or decisions of central government, local authorities, or other public bodies in the UK or abroad.
- **Party-Political Activity**: Any activity that supports or opposes a political party or candidate. *This is prohibited*.

5. Permitted Activities

Coodal may:

- Campaign to raise awareness of issues relevant to our beneficiaries.
- Seek to influence government policy or legislation in line with our charitable purposes.
- Publish research, reports, and evidence to inform public debate.

- Work with political parties and politicians on issues relevant to our mission, provided we remain strictly independent.
- Join coalitions or networks that campaign on relevant issues, provided we maintain our independence.

6. Prohibited Activities

Coodal will not:

- Endorse, fund, or oppose any political party, elected representative, or candidate.
- Allow the charity's name, funds, or resources to be used for party-political purposes.
- Permit staff, trustees, or volunteers to express personal political views in a way that could be seen as representing the charity.

7. Procedures

7.1 Approval

- All campaigning or political activity proposals must be approved by the Board of Trustees (or a delegated sub-committee).
- Activities must include a clear statement of how they further Coodal's charitable objects.
- Risk assessments must be undertaken for significant campaigns.

7.2 Conduct

- Staff and volunteers must act in a way that upholds Coodal's independence and reputation.
- All communications must be balanced, evidence-based, and respectful.
- Media statements on political issues must be cleared by the Chair or CEO.

7.3 Monitoring

- The Board will receive regular updates on campaigning and political activity.
- Activities will be reviewed annually to ensure compliance with charity law.

8. Responsibilities

- Trustees: Ensure compliance with Charity Commission guidance.
- Senior Management: Implement policy and monitor risks.
- Staff & Volunteers: Follow the policy and report concerns.

9. Breaches

Any breach of this policy may lead to disciplinary action and, if necessary, reporting to the Charity Commission.

10. Review

This policy will be reviewed every two years or sooner if legislation or Charity Commission guidance changes.
